

ORDINANCE #504 of 2016

AMENDMENT TO THE BOROUGH OF FOREST CITY ORDINANCE #455

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF FOREST CITY,
SUSQUEHANNA COUNTY AND COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA,
AMENDING ORDINANCE #455 OF FOREST CITY BOROUGH AND
PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Forest City Borough has the authority vested in it by the Borough Code and amendments thereto to regulate the consumption of alcohol on borough owned property;

WHEREAS, Forest City Borough Council has determined the restrictions on the consumption of alcohol on the Forest City Borough's property known as Kennedy Park as set forth in the subject Ordinance are deemed no longer warranted; and

WHEREAS, Borough Council of the Borough of Forest City desires to amend the said Ordinance to allow the consumption of alcohol (with separately defined and adopted rules and regulation) on the Forest City Borough's property known as Kennedy Park; and


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Council of Forest City Borough, Susquehanna County and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and by this Ordinance it is hereby Ordained and Enacted that Ordinance #455 amended as follows:

"Section 1: ...

c. Public Access Property – any public street, alley, sidewalk, park (other than the park known as Kennedy Park) playground, ball field, recreation areas, commons, or parking lots; or any private parking lots open to public use (regardless if the private parking lot establishment is open or closed for business). Public access property does not encompass duly licensed areas as may be so designated by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board, nor the Forest City Borough's property known as Kennedy Park (with separately defined and adopted policies and regulations)."

ORDAINED, ENACTED and EFFECTED into law by the Council of Forest City Borough, this 6th day of June, 2016.


