

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING OWNERS, CUSTODIANS AND KEEPERS  
OF DOGS FROM ALLOWING SUCH DOGS TO RUN AT LARGE AND  
PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION THEREOF:

Be it hereby ordained and enacted by the Borough  
of Hop Bottom, Susquehanna County, Pennsylvania, that  
from and after the effective date of the within ordinance  
which shall be the date of passage hereof as follows:

Section 1 - It shall be unlawful for the owner,  
custodian or keeper of any dog to allow such dog to  
run at large at any time, either upon any of the streets,  
alleys or public grounds in the Borough of Hop Bottom, or  
upon the property of another than the owner, custodian or  
keeper of such dog, unless accompanied by and under the  
immediate control of such owner, custodian or keeper.

Section 2 - Any owner, custodian or keeper of  
any dog who shall violate any of the provisions of  
the first section of this ordinance shall, upon  
conviction thereof be sentenced to pay a fine of  
ten dollars (\$10.00) and costs of prosecution, and,  
in default of payment of such fine and costs, to  
imprisonment for not more than five (5) days.
