

ORDINANCE NO. 76

An ordinance designating certain portions of Broad Street and Ward Street in the Borough of New Milford, Susquehanna County, Pennsylvania, as one way Streets for Vehicular Traffic.

The Borough of New Milford, Susquehanna County, Pennsylvania, hereby ordains:

SECTION 1

That Broad Street between Main Street and Church Street is hereby declared to be a one way thoroughfare with its entrance at Main Street and its exit at Church Street. It is unlawful for any operator of a vehicle to enter or proceed on that portion of Broad Street designated in this section as a one way thoroughfare except in an eastbound direction.

SECTION 2

That Broad Street between Main Street and the intersection of the D.L. & W. Railroad right of way is hereby declared to be a one way thoroughfare with its entrance on Main Street and its exit at the D. L. & W. Railroad right of way and at Extension-Division Street. It is unlawful for any operator of a vehicle to enter or proceed on that portion of Broad Street designated in this section as a one way thoroughfare except in a westbound direction.

SECTION 3

That Ward Street between Main Street and the intersection of Division Street is hereby declared to be a one way thoroughfare with its entrance from Division Street or from that portion of Ward Street lying west of Division Street and its exit on Main Street. It is unlawful for any operator of a vehicle to enter or proceed upon that portion of Ward Street designated in this section as a one way thoroughfare except in an eastbound direction.

SECTION 4

All persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of not more than twenty five dollars (\$25) for each offense, and each daily occurrence of the same offense shall be considered a new offense and fineable as such. In default of payment of the fine the offender shall be imprisoned in the county jail for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days.

All ordinances or resolutions or parts thereof inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.
