

WASTE MANAGEMENT ORDINANCETOWNSHIP OF BROOKLYN

An ordinance prohibiting the accumulation and burying of garbage and/or refuse brought into the Township of Brooklyn from outside its borders upon private property in said Township of Brooklyn and providing penalties for the violation of said ordinance.

WHEREAS, it is the purpose and intention of this ordinance enacted under the power of the Township of Brooklyn, Susquehanna County, Pennsylvania, to regulate and control garbage and/or refuse from outside the Township of Brooklyn in order to maintain, provide for and protect the health, safety and sanitation of the inhabitants of this Township.

NOW THEREFORE, be it enacted and ordained by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Brooklyn, Susquehanna County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION I: Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases when used in this ordinance shall have the meaning hereinafter ascribed to them, except when the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

"Garbage and/or Refuse" - shall mean any waste material constituting "solid waste" as defined in the Solid Waste Management Act (Act of July 7, 1980, P.L. 380, 35 P. S. 6018.101 et seq.) enacted by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, as amended to the date of this Ordinance.

SECTION II: General.

It shall be unlawful for any person to accumulate or bury garbage and/or refuse brought into the Township of Brooklyn from outside its borders or permit another to accumulate or bury garbage and/or refuse brought into Brooklyn Township from outside its borders.

SECTION III: Penalty.

Any person or any officer of any firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall upon conviction thereof before a District Magistrate be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than One Hundred and 00/100 (\$100.00) Dollars and not more than Three Hundred and 00/100 (\$300.00) Dollars together with costs of prosecution or in default thereof, to imprisonment in the Susquehanna County Jail for a period of not more than thirty (30) days. Each and every day such violation shall continue shall be a separate offense and shall be subject to the penalty imposed by this Section for each and every separate offense.

SECTION IV:

Should any Section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

This ordinance to be effective five (5) days after enactment.
